From the Principal

October 31st at Oak Park-Carpenter Elementary

Students will be allowed to wear costumes to school and throughout the day. But first and foremost, is learning. If a costume interferes with learning in the classroom, the student will be asked to change. Some children and/or their families are frightened by, or are sensitive to costumes that are violent, occult, macabre, anti-religious. Since the school wants to teach children to cooperate, resolve conflicts and be sensitive to all points of view, costumes are not to focus on violent or frightening themes that include weapons, blood or gore. This will require more thought and planning, but it should result in more original, creative and fun costumes!

- **Costume parade will begin at 2:10 p.m.** (in the circle drive, or in the gym if inclement weather)
 - Spectators for the parade will stand in the blocked-off circle drive in the front of the building. Students will exit the building through the north front exit, parade down the front sidewalk, re-enter the building through the main entrance or south entrance next to the gym, then go to the location of their parties.

Classroom parties from 2:30-3:00 p.m.

- Classroom parties may enjoy **prepackaged treats with the labels attached**

- Everyone is welcome to attend the Halloween parties! Please be prepared to assist with setup, activities, and cleanup when you attend. All costumes worn by adults and students must be appropriate and elementary aged themes – no weapons, no blood, and no violent themed costumes will be allowed. If you need assistance in getting a costume for your child please contact Mrs. Morgan.

Costume design and content

- **No full face paint or masks may be worn.**
- **Costumes with scary, gory, violent, or insulting themes are NOT allowed**, in order to respect the varying ages and values of every child.
- Anything that can injure or intimidate others is **never** allowed at school. **No weapons of any kind are allowed on school property at any time.** Refer to your Shawnee Mission Weapons Policy if you have questions.

District Policy on *Returned Checks*

The district has a returned check policy that began June 1, 2007. **All returned checks are processed by a collection agency and a \$30 fee is assessed for each returned item to cover the cost of these services.** This is in addition to any charges assessed by your bank. Since the charge is being assessed by the agency for their service, the charge cannot be waived. You may want to ask your local bank about overdraft protection services.

This recommendation has been in place since February 24, 2010 when CDC's Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices (ACIP) voted for 'universal' flu vaccination in the United States to expand protection against the flu to more people."

Myths	Truths
1. Head lice are easy to get.	Lice are spread by direct head-to-head contact. They are much harder to get than a cold, the flu, pink eye, or strep throat. With that said, approximately 1 in 100 children will have head lice each year.
2. Lice are often passed through hats and helmets.	Rare, but possible. Sharing hair brushes, pillows and sheets are much more common ways of spreading head lice.
3. School is a common place for transmission.	School is a VERY RARE source of transmission. Much more common is family members, overnight guests, and playmates that spend large amounts of time together.
4. Head Lice are a serious disease.	Lice do not spread any known disease. They are annoying and anxiety producing but cause no disease.
5. Lice can fly or jump from one person to another.	Lice only crawl! Further, they prefer to stay on the head currently providing a free lunch.
6. Any nits (eggs) left on the hair can lead to a re-infestation of head lice.	Nits further away than $\frac{1}{4}$ inch from the scalp have likely hatched and pose no additional threat.
7. Nits can fall out of the hair, hatch and cause spread to other individuals.	Nits are cemented to the hair and very difficult to remove. Also, newly hatched larvae must find a meal immediately or they perish.
8. Lice can live a long time off the head.	Lice live at the most 24 to 48 hours off the head.
9. Checking a classroom when one student has head lice can prevent lice from spreading.	Classroom transmission is EXTREMELY RARE. Checking every student's head is a waste of valuable teaching time and would likely not find an early case. Checking family members and playmates is much more appropriate.
10. Once present, it is very difficult to get rid of Lice.	There are new prescription products that have proven to be both safe and very effective for eliminating lice. The school nurse can help you use your time and money wisely in regard to Head Lice.

Things **parents** can do to assist with prevention of spread of Head Lice:

- Frequently monitor the heads of young children for signs of head lice (nits present at the nape of the neck or above the ears), especially if children are displaying symptoms of itchy scalp.
- Report cases of head lice to the school nurse. The school nurse is happy to assist and provide information about new effective products for elimination of head lice.
- Inform parents of your child's playmates if they have been exposed to head lice.
- Above all, remain calm and remember head lice do not spread any known disease.
